Amenities galore on northeast Indianapolis

For an apartment convenient to major transportation routes, shopping and entertainment, look northeast. This popular area extends roughly from Fall Creek Parkway on the east to Keystone Avenue on the west and north of 38th Street into Fishers in Hamilton County.

In the neighborhood

"All sorts of people choose the area because it's handy to shopping, restaurants and movie theaters," said Luke Gilliatt, property manager at The Orchard, a recently renovated apartment community of one- and two-bedroom garden apartments just east of Interstate 465. "Plus, with our easy access to the interstate, residents can get to work anywhere in the city." On-site recreational choices are part of the lifestyle at most northeast-side apartment communities. The Orchard is typical, with amenities such as a 24-hour tanning and fitness facility, lighted tennis courts, a swimming pool and sand volleyball courts.

Harbour Pointe offers large one- and two-bedroom apartments with spacious closets, washer-dryer hookups and personal alarm systems in a wooded setting on Fall Creek Parkway North.

The community includes a clubhouse, pool and sundeck, fitness center and hiking trails — all minutes from Castleton and Downtown.

Fountain Parc, on East 62nd Street west of Binford Boulevard, has seven apartment models ranging from 787 to 1,432 square feet. Living rooms have a brick accent wall, new kitchens have stainless-steel appliances and each apartment has a breakfast bar. Tenants have access to a kidney-shaped swimming pool and fitness center, with fountains in the park-like courtyards.

Out and about

Recreation choices include some of the city's best public parks and trails, such as the Fall Creek Greenway Trail;

Town Run Trail Park, with its nine miles of single-track dirt trails along the west side of the White River below 96th Street; and Sahm Park, with an aquatic center and an 18-hole golf course.

"Tenants choose to live at Willows at Castleton because of its many amenities and convenient location," according to Ivana "Ivy" Tworek, property manager. "We have large apartments, and we don't charge extra for things like fireplaces, built-in bookcases and walk-in closets."

Residents easily access Castleton and Carmel, where many work and even more shop and eat, according to Tworek. ■

Vital stats: Northeast Indianapolis

Transportation: Easy access via Allisonville Road, I-465, I-37 and I-69.

Rent: From \$359 for a studio/efficiency to \$1,175 for a three-bedroom, two-bath apartment home.

Pets: Most communities allow pets, especially cats and small dogs.

Amenities: Communities include recreational facilities (pool, fitness center, tennis courts and hiking trails), clubhouse, wooded landscaping, and covered parking or garages. Some properties have high-speed Internet access and executive business centers.

Shopping: Close to 82nd Street/86th Street shopping district, restaurants and entertainment choices.
